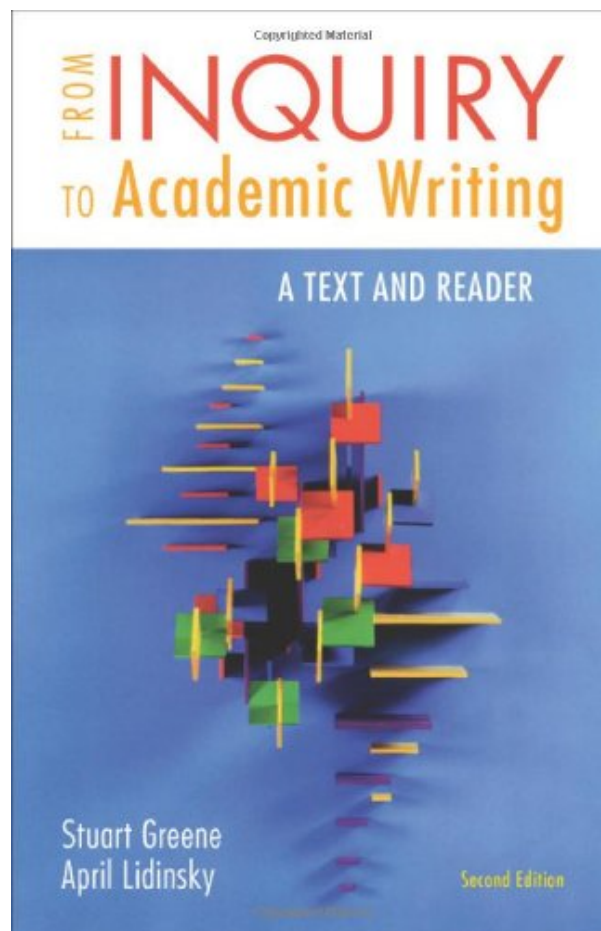
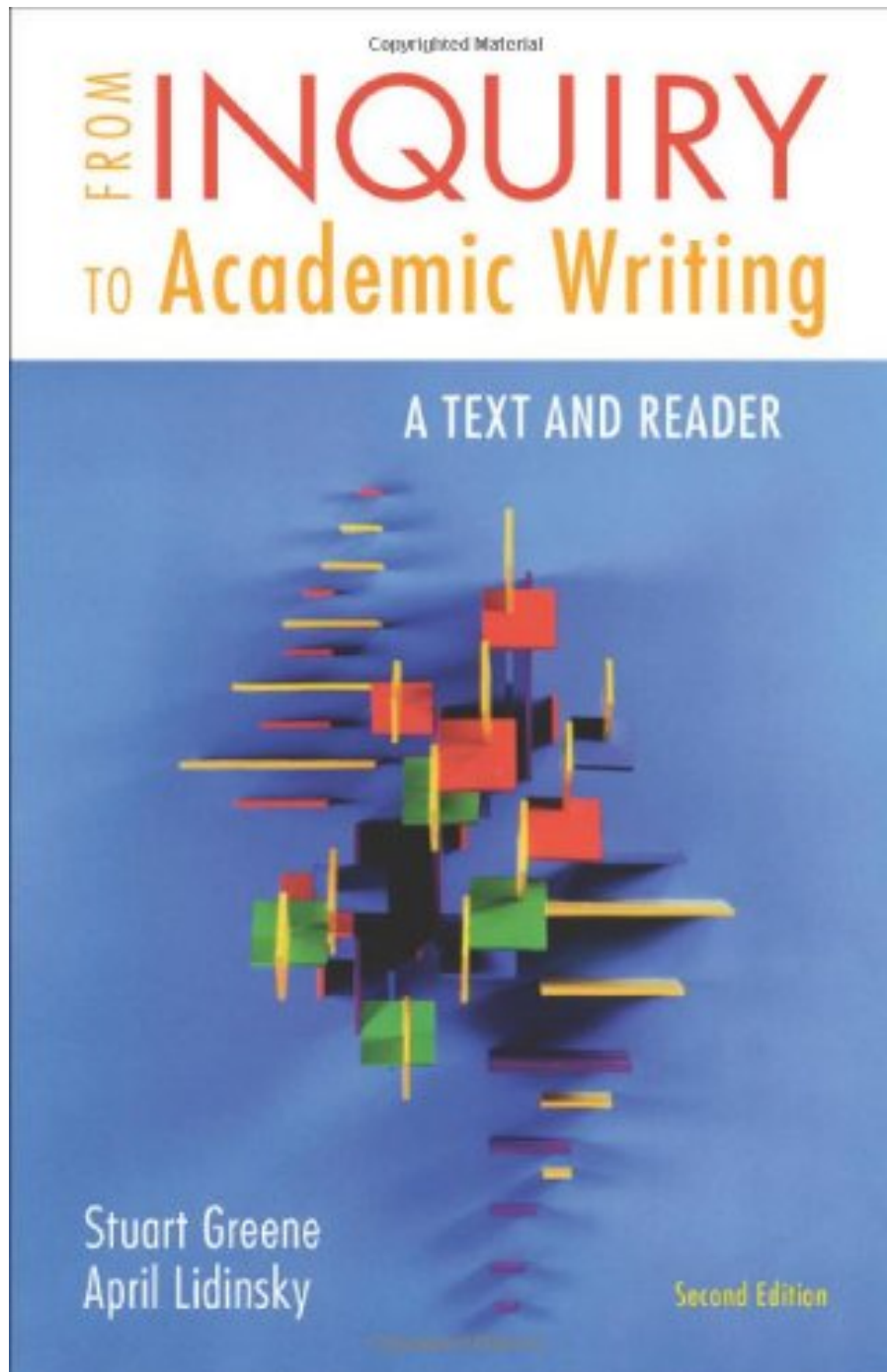


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STUART GREENE (Ph.D in Rhetoric, Carnegie Mellon University) is associate professor of English at the University of Notre Dame where he has served as the O'Malley Director of the University Writing Program and Associate Dean for Undergraduate Studies in Arts and Letters. Among his co-edited volumes is *Making Race Visible: Literacy Research for Racial Understanding*, for which he won the National Council of Teachers of English Richard A.
